Your Proposal should include the following information (listed in the following order):

1. presentation category (paper, workshop, colloquium, poster)
2. title of the presentation (maximum ten words)
3. your contact info: last name, first name, department, affiliation, address, phone, e-mail
4. co-presenter(s) contact info (if applicable) : last name, first name, department, affiliation, mailing address, phone, e-mail
5. 50-word (maximum) summary of the presentation (for conference program)
6. 250-word (maximum) abstract, including:
  - content/format of presentation
  - benefit to participants
  - target audience: (i.e., levels and languages)
  - orientation (methods, materials, political action, program development, research)
  - equipment needs - overhead projector, VCR/TV, computer/Internet (software)
7. 25-word (maximum) biographical notes to be used to introduce you
